

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Special Programs: Project Austin

Children with complex, special health care needs

- Family-centered, team and community-based
- Program enrollment is optional
- Emergency Information Form (EIF) completed with family
- EIF sent to child's local EMS, community hospital, primary care provider, and caregivers
- Education provided to community contacts and responders, if requested
- If emergency happens, 911 dispatch and local medical professionals will know "Project Austin"
